

# JOHN CAMERON :



John Cameron is a musician, meteorologist, and United States Navy veteran. He has been involved with the Texoma music scene for over 30 years. During that time he has encountered some of the greatest musicians to come out of the area. Some of his musical influences include Child Gambino, The Police, and Kendrick Lamar.

Through my years as a drummer I've had brushes with music greatness. My parents bought me my first drum kit in the summer of 1986 (I was 14) and almost immediately I found myself surrounded by high impact musicians in Lawton. The man who had the biggest influence on my development as a drummer and lover of music was Matthew Gaskins, the guitar player and singer in my first legitimate band, Rosemary Wisdom. Once we disbanded Matt went on to Denton to create one of the most amazing bands I've ever heard, 53 Large Men. This would have been in the mid '90s. Matt is now a music instructor at a private academy in McKinney. Before I met Matt, I was all about Led Zeppelin, Rush and hard rockin' stuff. Matt opened my eyes to XTC, Steely Dan, the Police, Sugarcubes, etc. Suddenly my musical world expanded. (Rosemary Wisdom played our local 724 A.D., by the way)

In my neighborhood in Lawton as a Jr High/High School student, I would walk past one particular house and hear these HUGE John Bonham style drum beats. I soon discovered that was the

My wife and I moved to Wichita Falls in 1997. I can't remember how I connected to the music scene but I remember Chris Burney inviting me to his rehearsal space to check out Bowling For



home of Steven Drozd. Back then he was a reclusive music genius, today he's known as the innovative musical mind of the Flaming Lips. Steve was originally hired to play drums for Flaming Lips in the early '90s. By the late '90s his musical contributions garnered widespread critical acclaim.

When did you come to Wichita Falls?

Soup. Jaret and Chris were very cool to me. When I played drums for a classic rock band "Time Machine", I remember opening for Bowling For Soup at least twice at Chelsea Street. It was located where Red Robin is now. This would have been around '98-99. Nolan Cannedy of Miyagi became the singer for Time Machine just about the time I decided to leave the band. That had nothing to do

with Nolan. Love that guy.

Some other items of interest include In 1999 I won a drum solo contest hosted by Tarpley Music. That led to guitar player Mike McAdoo inviting me to Johnny Divine's studio to record a demo/ album for a thirteen year old Luke Robinson. Mark Murphey was part of that session, too. I also auditioned to play drums for Bigloo. I made the mistake of telling them I didn't have a lot of blues experience. Cool cats, though. I was also in a band with Dan Dickens, who was the morning weather guy from KFDX. So, two guys from rival TV stations were in the same band. If that wasn't awkward enough, we played the KFDX Christmas party at least once. This would have been around '03-04'. Dan is one of the sweetest people you'll be in the same room with. Such a gentle soul.

What are some of the recent projects you've worked on?
Back in 2012 Ken Nelson of Killdevil and Kelly Jackson (now with Hellen Bach) asked me to be part of a New Orleans style horn band called Bayou Funk Debris (BFD). These guys were big time players who really kept me sharp. The daily challenge was keeping up with their level of musicianship. Unfortunately a horn band is often a big band, so getting several musicians on a regular rehearsal

schedule was problematic.

Now I'm in a band called Romeo Whiskey. This is actually the second band I'm in with the name Romeo Whiskey. Back in the late '90s I teamed up with Roland Zachary, Elvis Propest, Matt Norris and Danny Craig. Unfortunately the band didn't last long enough to develop name recognition, so we felt it would be safe to recycle the name. -Kaeli Fowler



# DRA LAMBE

If you have any interest at all in local art, then you probably already know something about Audra Lambert. What you may not know about her is that she only recently turned to painting



as her primary artistic outlet. She has spent most of her art career print making and doing small sculptures. She graduated from MSU with a Bachelor In Fine Arts a few years ago and turned toward painting after collaborating with Ralph Stearn on a massive outdoor mural that was 140 feet by 18 feet. "Ralph showed me how to take a small design and place it on a large scape", says Audra. "This was the first mural I had ever been paid to help paint. It was trial by fire and now nothing scares me as far as how big it is".

Audra's list of murals is steadily growing and includes a recent piece at the Sheppard Air Force Base Spiritual Development Center. While there she was able to visit their train-

ing planes up close to reference the large indoor mural. She calls The Seventh St. Studio her home and you can usually catch her there working on whichever medium she fancies at the time. Audra is the newest, and youngest, president of the Wichita Falls Art Association. She says that she is excited about the surge of local art and the direction this community is going.



# TIPS AND TALES FROM OUTBACK

with Johnny Divine (Outback Studios 940-613-8436)

Since this issue of The Hub is featuring Wichita Falls' own Bowling for Soup, I think it might be appropriate for me to exploit my connection with this exceptional group of musicians! The first time I heard these guys (outside of my studio) was in a Dillard's department store in San Antonio. They were blasting one of their songs through the speakers in the ceiling. This may not seem like the best scenario to hear someone for the first time, but surprisingly, it sounded great and actually had some volume pumping, too! I was tempted to buy two brand new suits right then and there!! Now, that's some shopping music!

But on to my first encounter! A very young and pre-Bowling for Soup member, Jaret Reddick, came to me with a collection of songs that for some reason needed to be finished up in my recording studio. If I remember correctly, it seems he had recorded some of the tracks before he got there, but needed additional help. I remember that each song title was only one word (I remember one of those titles being Winnebago! Is that right, Jaret??), and my first thought was that this young man thinks things through! The music was tight, his singing was great, and the songs were quirky, but very musical, and brimming with a sense of humor. When Jaret finished, I told him how much he owed me and he looked kind of surprised and said, "I thought you were doing this as a hobby". I explained that Outback Studios was actually a business that fed my kids, paid my bills, and allowed me to be a very snobby capitalist!! Somehow we worked it out (I think he paid me! Lol!), but I always worried that it got me and Jaret off to a shaky start. Hope all is forgiven...

I guess things weren't too tense with Jaret's new band and me, because on down the road Chris Burney, another Soup member, called and asked if I could digitally re-master their first album. Basically, I recorded their analog master straight to my Digital Audio Tape recorder (they were rare in those days) and then got credit right on the back of that album: "Digitally Re-Mastered by Johnny Divine"! I'm still very proud of that.

My next encounter was being at a gas station in Burkburnett when Jaret pulled up in a brand new van. He told me he had just bought it



for Bowling for Soup and they were going to tow an equipment trailer behind it, hit the road, and see what happens! Well, it happened! Continued congratulations To Jaret, Chris, Erik, and Gary. You deserve it!

There have been whispers, murmurs, and even misinformation about the soon to open Highlander Public House, so we went straight to the owner, Chef Erik Scott, to find out what's really going on. Upon first entry to the "still under construction" pub and restaurant, my impression was that I entered the sit-com Cheers and expected everyone to know my name. The

rich and ornate wooden bar area that will host an intimate seating area was already calling me to sit down and enjoy a bit of whiskey, but that will have to wait until my next visit. I am welcomed by Erik and his family, along with the General Manager Kent Hoover, and they certainly re-enforced that "Cheers" feeling. They are a friendly bunch and are eager to share the fruits of their labor with the community. The Highlander will be celebrating its



grand opening on St. Patrick's Day, March 17th, with live music and a full menu. In fact, they will have food available until 2am every day of the week. The menu will include items from fish & chips and Shepard's pie to chicken and steak entrees. Chef Erik explained, "We're not your traditional pub, but more like a Texas pub. I'm a chef and to me food comes first. I do simple dishes and I do them well". It gets better. They will have full Sunday brunch, complete with Mimosas and Bloody Marys. They will also have full service on their patio, which will be pet friendly. Be sure and find them on Facebook to keep up with everything they have going on! # RALDH STEARNS

Ann Arnold-Ogden of ChooseWF.com recently wrote and shared a story about local artist and muralist, Ralph Stearns. We love Ann and think Ralph is an amazing talent so it is our pleasure to share Ann's story spotlighting Ralph and his art.

While Breckenridge claims the title of Mural Capitol of Texas, Wichita Falls is giving the city a run for its money with artist Ralph Stearns leading the charge. Stearns has at least nine murals across Downtown Wichita Falls, with many others in offices, schools and beyond. For the last 40 years, Stearns says he's been a student of art.

He moved to Wichita Falls in the 4th grade, and graduated from Petrolia High School. He enlisted for two years in the U.S. Marine Corps, and moved back to Wichita Falls to attend Midwestern State University upon being discharged. He obtained a Bachelor of Fine Arts and started work as a commercial artist with Lamar Advertising. He continues to learn new techniques and styles all the time. His first mural downtown came in 2005. Stearns painted a giant parrot and life-size man peering at one another. Stearns said that started the ball rolling with other mural projects Downtown.

When it comes to painting, Stearns likes to experiment with different techniques. "I don't really have a particular style," he says. "I range from photorealism to abstract and impressionism." After

years creating large scale works of art including hamburgers and cars, he says creating murals appeals to him on many levels. Other downtown mural projects Stearns has completed include King Kong, the Hotter'N Hell building and work on the Branding Iron. He loves that his art is able to reach a broad audience. "A lot of times you paint a piece of work and it sits in your

house and no one gets to see it," he says. "This is public art. Your audience is always there."

His most recent mural is a pair of eyes with splashes of bright paint surrounding them. The painting is on the exterior of a building owned by local businessman and fellow artist Smith Walker. Walker wanted something splashy on a blank exterior wall of his new art gallery, located at 1106 8th Street.

"Ralph has done probably a dozen murals for me. He's the best," Walker says. "The building is really one of the entrances to Downtown. I wanted something that was kind of sexy and seductive, fun and exciting. We wanted people to come over that hill and get a 'Welcome to Downtown' feel." Walker says his initial goal was to attract people to the building, which houses shops and galleries. Stearns says one of the tenants gave him the idea for "Cleopatra's eyes." Now eyes are drawn on the building, and to it.

"I researched eyes, and started looking at all these other artists works. Especially splash art," he says. "They put watercolor down and use a straw to blow it around and it splatters. There's a lot of people doing splash art. It's just beautiful."

Plans are already in the works for his next collaboration with Walker. While Stearns would rather not reveal details about the

> project yet, he promises it will be "edgy" and "illuminating." He says while he has other projects going, he hopes to continue creating street art. A goal Walker is happy to support.

> "As an artist, I want art everywhere. I would love to see more murals on buildings. In the alleys. That's my vision for down-

town," Walker says.
